

WEST NILE VIRUS AND OTHER ARBOVIRAL DISEASES



Report #4: 2025 Season

October 10, 2025

- In 2025 to date, the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health (LA County DPH) has documented 11 [West Nile virus](#) (WNV) human infections and no deaths (Table 1). Of these, 7 were symptomatic with the most recent onset occurring 9/10/25. Nearly half of infected persons reside in the San Fernando Valley region (45%).
- The number of persons infected in the 2025 season is fewer than the 5-year average (Figure 1). [Mosquito pools and dead birds](#) are testing positive across many areas of LA County. The California Department of Public Health has [reported](#) 54 symptomatic human cases in the state. Nationally, 1,433 symptomatic human cases have been [reported to the CDC](#).

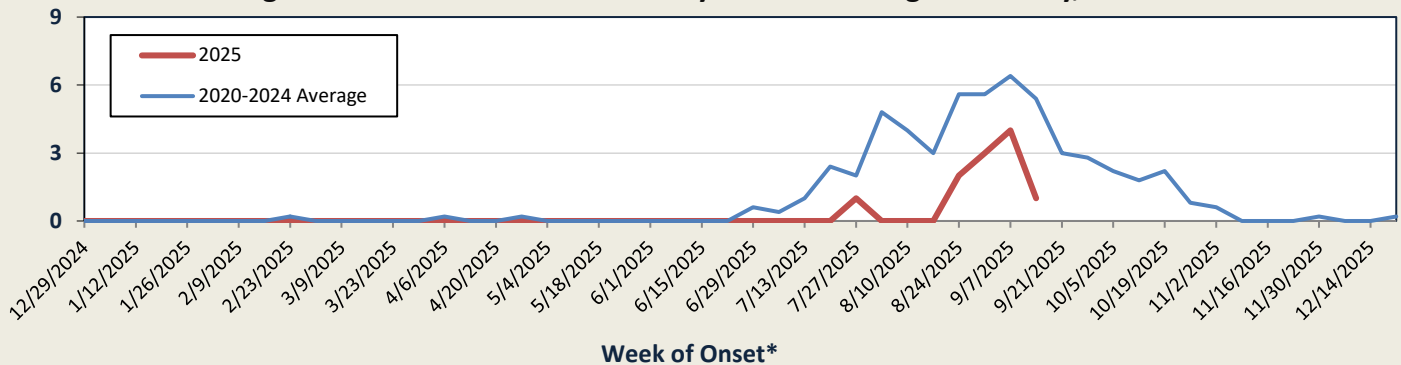

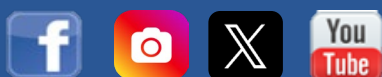
