Hot Weather Safety Tips

With temperatures increasing this season, here are some tips to protect yourself and those around you:

- Keep yourself and your pets hydrated. Drink more fluids, regardless of how active you are. Don't wait until you're thirsty to drink.
- If your home lacks air conditioning, seek refuge in shopping malls or public libraries. <u>Check for</u> emergency cooling centers in your community.
- Sunburn reduces your body's ability to cool down and can lead to dehydration. Wear a wide-brimmed hat and sunglasses outdoors, and apply sunscreen with SPF 15 or higher at least 30 minutes before going

National Immunization Awareness Month

Part of staying healthy is keeping up with necessary vaccinations. In August, we raise awareness around vaccinations to ensure a healthy fall and winter for you and your loved ones.

Reasons to get vaccinated:

 Stay Healthy: Vaccines protect us from getting serious illnesses and feeling really sick.



- **Protect Your Loved Ones:** By getting vaccinated, we also protect those who can't get vaccinated, like infants and those with weakened immune systems.
- Avoid Disruptions: Vaccinations mean less chance of changing our plans or missing important activities because of illness.
- Safe Schools and Activities: Vaccinations are a vital part of keeping schools and activities safe for everyone involved.

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National Breastfeeding Month: Nourish, Shine, Thrive

Breastfeeding is good for both you and your baby. Breast milk is the best source of nutrition for most babies. As your baby grows, your breast milk will change to meet his or her nutritional needs. Breastfeeding can also help protect you and your baby against some short- and long-term illnesses and diseases.

Families often encounter various challenges with breastfeeding, which can lead to shorter breastfeeding durations than they originally planned. Additionally, significant disparities in breastfeeding rates continue to exist across different racial and ethnic groups. The consistent month-to-month decline in both any and exclusive breastfeeding suggests that families may require more robust support systems to successfully achieve their breastfeeding goals. Los Angeles County is committed to ensuring that mothers and families have access to breastfeeding and chest feeding education, support, and resources to reach their breastfeeding goals.

Free Gun Locks





In 2025, OVP is committed to distributing more than 60,000 cable gun locks – free of charge and no questions asked – across Los Angeles County. This unprecedented effort is designed to keep children safe from firearms, limit the possibility that a person intent on harming themselves or others can quickly secure a loaded, unlocked weapon, and guard against the theft of guns. LA Health Portal E-Visits

Need care now? An eVisit is a quick, convenient online care choice for common medical concerns. An eVisit gives patients access to care from a provider who can order tests and/or medicines without a trip to the doctor's office. eVisits are a great choice for common medical concerns like:

- Cold or Flu
- Headache
- Muscle Aches
- Skin Rash
- Sore Throat
- Urinary Problems
- Vaginal Problems

How it works

- Sign in to LA Health Portal and fill out an eVisit form.
- Get a response email from a provider within 1 hour from 8 am to 8 pm, 7 days a week.*
- The provider will answer your questions and order tests and/or medicines if needed.

*E-visits sent after 8 pm will receive an answer the following day.

Community Public Health Teams

Community Public Health Teams (CPHT) is a project that brings together community-based organizations, health care partners, and Public Health staff. These teams work at the household level, conducting home visits to gather health needs and connect people to care and also works at the community level, inviting people to participate in creating community action plans.

This is a new approach to public health and health care in LA County.

Public Health is investing public health infrastructure dollars to implement

this pilot project for five years, beginning August 2023. The goal is to build long-term relationships with households, empower communities to define the health priorities that matter to them, and demonstrate that this new way of engagement can support better health outcomes.



ach CPHT implements five core strategies

Visit each household annually to condu household assessments

Ensure households are connected to health care and social services

Analyze data on health, mental health and social determinants of health

Mobilize partners to advance her



Angelenos in Action

Join Angelenos in Action, a voluntary public health survey that takes less than 1-minute each week and helps the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health monitor respiratory illness throughout the County.

Here's how it works:

- 1. Text "@PROTECT" to (833) 228-3056 to volunteer for our survey or sign up online using this link: http://tinyurl.com/ys6se6we.
- 2. Answer 5 quick questions to sign up.
- 3. You will be randomized to receive surveys one day a week.
- Every week on that day, the LA County Department of Public Health will text or email you one YES/NO question to ask how you're feeling.

Office of Violence Prevention - GVRO's (Gun Violence Restraining Orders)




A Gun Violence Restraining Order, or GVRO, is a law that was approved by the State of California in 2016. The GVRO allows family members, household members, some employers, colleagues, teachers, and law enforcement to take action to prevent a person who poses a significant risk of harming themselves or others from having or purchasing a

gun, ammunition, or magazine for a specified length of time, between 21 days and five years. To find out more on who can request one, and how to request one, please see: http://tinyurl.com/y3hfb575.

Free Naloxone Clinics
