The Basics: State Prison vs. County Jail

	 <u>State Prison</u>	<u>County Jail</u> 
 Governing Entity	State Level: California Department of Corrections & Rehabilitation (CDCR)	Local-level: Board of State & Community Corrections (BSCC)
 Healthcare Provider	CDCR Division of Health Care Services (California Correctional Health Care Services)	County (i.e. Sheriff's Dept.) OR For-Profit Entity (i.e. CFMG, Corizon)
 Inmate Population	Longer-term More serious offenses Have been sentenced Not all released back to community	Shorter-term Less serious offenses Pending trials/sentencing 100% released back to community

California Facilities

- 493 jail facilities
 - Ranging from holding sites to large detention centers
- 169 juvenile facilities
 - Halls, justice centers, camps, group homes

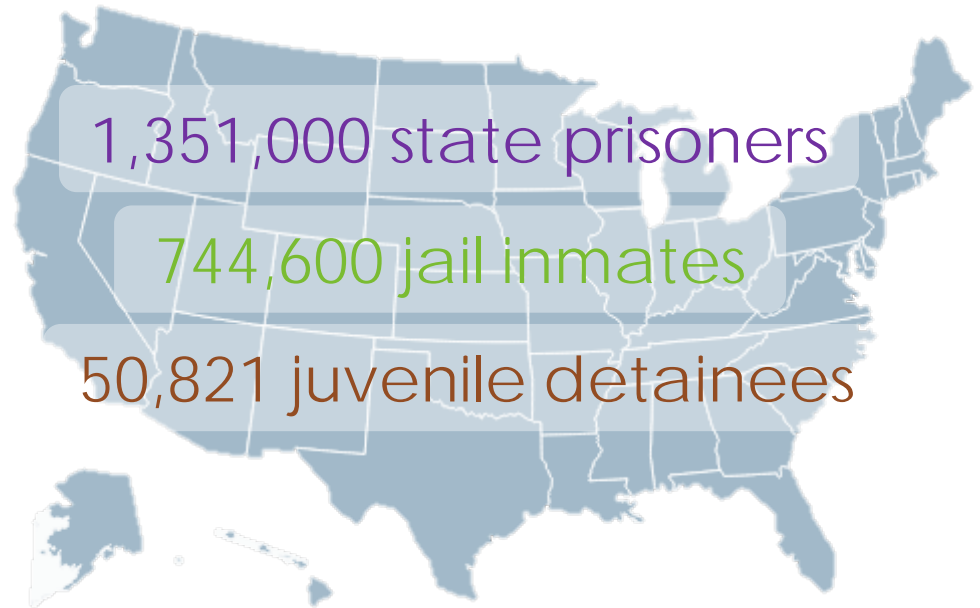
Correctional Population, 2014-16



129,160 state prisoners

73,891 jail inmates

3,325 juvenile detainees



1,351,000 state prisoners

744,600 jail inmates

50,821 juvenile detainees

Public Safety Realignment (2011)

- Goal: stop “revolving door” of lower-level offenders through state prison system
- Local jurisdictions take up the responsibility for all sentenced non-violent, non-serious, non-sex offenders
- Creation of a new agency to provide leadership to adult and juvenile facilities
 - Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC)

What is BSCC's role?

- Collect data (i.e. population, demographics)
- Establish minimum standards for detention facilities
- Biennial inspections of detention facilities
- Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act (JJDP) compliance monitoring
- Provide TA/training to detention facilities
 - BSCC does not support policy writing process
