MOBILE FOOD FACILITY

Each year in the U.S:

- More than 9 million people get sick
- 56,000 people are hospitalized
- More than 1,300 people die from contaminated food and drink

Be sure to purchase food from a permitted vendor.

A permitted mobile food facility, such as a food truck, food cart, trailer, or boat with food services, can sell food ranging from prepackaged chips and drinks to fully prepared meals.

Mobile food facilities in Los Angeles County must pass inspection, follow safe food handling practices, and have a valid Public Health Permit.

Permitted mobile food facilities offer people an easy and safe option to buy food wherever they are. Follow food safety rules to prevent foodborne illnesses.

All mobile food facilities permitted by Public Health must display a letter grade and certification sticker where it is easily seen by customers. Before you buy or eat food from a mobile food facility, check for:
