


Young children under age 6 are at high risk of lead exposure because their bodies are still developing.

Blood lead tests identify the concentration of lead in the blood at the time the sample was collected. Higher levels of lead in blood can be caused by environmental conditions, lead-based paint, consumer products, imported foods, certain jobs and hobbies involving working with lead-based products and other factors.



Nearly all test results from the community outreach (99%) were below the CDC reference level of 5 µg/dL.

While a safe level of lead has not been identified, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) uses 5 µg/dL (microgram per deciliter) as a reference level for blood lead.



Test results at or above the CDC reference level were referred to the Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program for education and case management, as appropriate.
