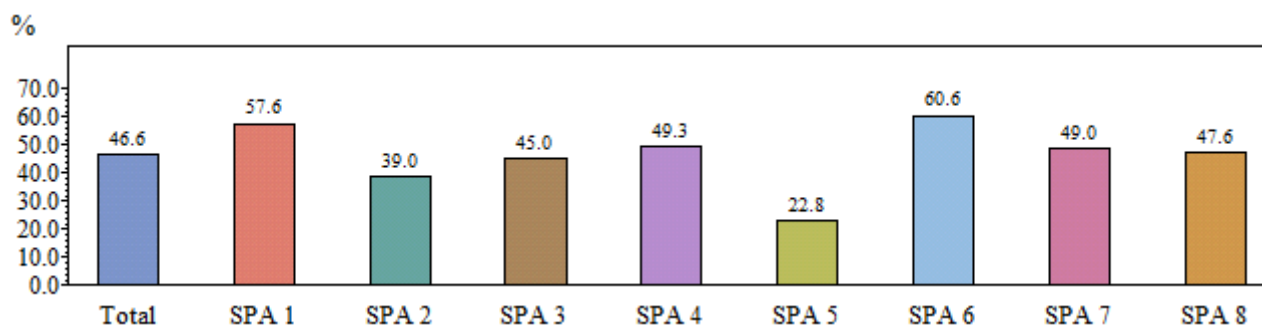


Family Planning Practices: Unwanted pregnancy/mistimed by mother

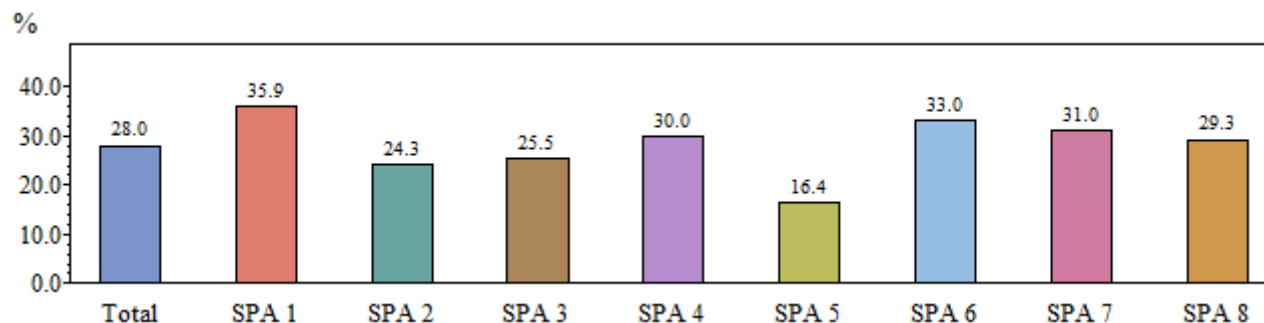

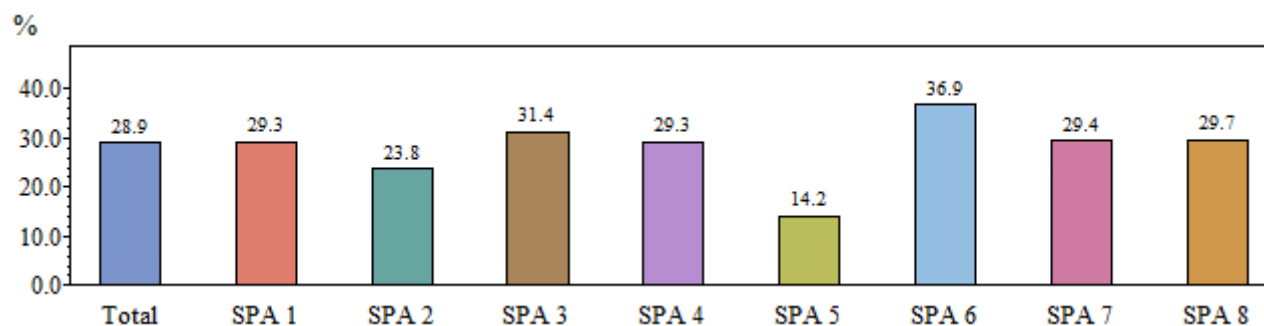

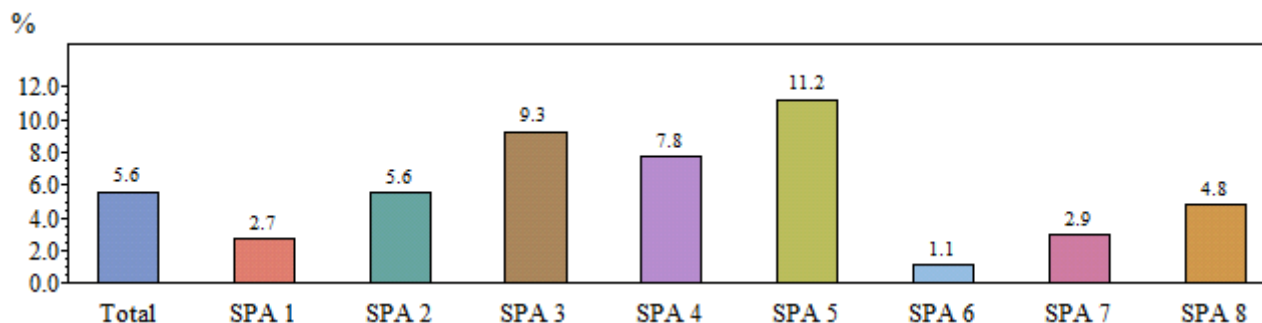

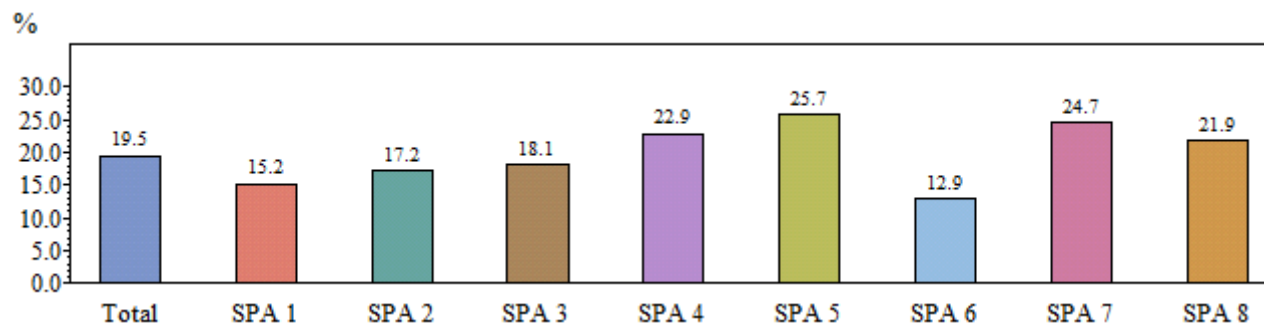
