Part 1: Quick Start – Registration

- 1. Users can register for SAPC-LNC in a variety of ways depending on their role. **SAPC-LNC supports three (3) types of users:**
 - SAPC Provider
 - Non-SAPC Provider
 - SAPC Staff
 - b. **SAPC Provider** register using either email invitations or using the online registration option.
 - Some Sage users may receive an email invitation from <u>INFO@SAPC-</u> <u>LNC.ORG</u>. Please use the unique registration link in the invitation email for registration.
 - All other SAPC providers can register online by accessing <u>HTTPS://SAPC-LNC.ORG</u>, click on **Register**, and complete the online form.
 - Some Sage users may be prompted to update your profile in case any essential information is missing. If you are prompted to complete your profile, complete the form and click UPDATE PROFILE.
 - c. Non-SAPC Provider will register online.
 - For online registration, go to <u>HTTPS://SAPC-LNC.ORG</u>, click on **Register**, and complete the online form.
 - d. **SAPC Staff** please contact <u>SAPC-LNC@PH.LACOUNTY.GOV</u> for assistance.

2. After you register, you will be taken to the **My Learning** page. This is your learning dashboard. Click **BROWSE TRAININGS** to view training catalog.

Part 2: Quick Start – Signing in and exploring the platform

- 1. For returning users, go to <u>HTTPS://SAPC-LNC.ORG</u>
- 2. View the homepage and explore everything on the page.







- 3. Things you can explore on the homepage:
 - a. Review the homepage. It has information about SAPC-LNC, the types of features found on the platform, an overview of the training libraries, and some options to view the training catalog.
 - b. Scroll down the page and review the content on the page including the Content Libraries section. Get started by clicking on the expand icon for the Sage Electronic Health Record Trainings.

- 4. There are a few ways to explore content on SAPC-LNC.
 - a. From the top menu: Select **Explore Content > Trainings** this will take you a list of all trainings.

Description

This training will focus on information meant to inform participants about the potential risks of overdose specifically with opioid substances, focusing on skills to recognize and respond to an overdose safely. The training will identify ways of responding to an overdose with Naloxone, demonstrate the techniques used to administer Naloxone, and discuss other steps needed to ensure peoples' health and safety. This training will also review current trends in substances of abuse, with specific focus on Fentanyl. Additionally, this training will focus on harm reduction strategies and Engagement and Overdose Prevention (EOP) Hubs that provide syringe exchange services in Los Angeles County. This training is meant as a resource for specialty behavioral prevention and treatment providers to utilize when working with youth, transitional age youth (TAY) and adult populations who are considered at risk of developing substance use disorders. Techniques for maximizing engagement will also be explored. Participants will be provided with a host of resources available in Los Angeles County, including information on the Substance Abuse Prevention and Control's Substance Use Disorder (SUD) prevention and treatment provider network, harm reduction and syringe exchange resources.

Learning Objectives

- 1. Discuss two (2) risk factors associated with increased risk of an opioid overdose and ways of utilizing harm reduction to decrease this risk.
- 2. Develop three (3) skills to effectively recognize and respond to individuals who may have overdosed on opioid substances with Naloxone.
- Evaluate three (3) harm reduction strategies and include appropriate resources that are available to youth, transitional age youth, adults, and substance use treatment providers in Los Angeles County.
- Identify three (3) methods of engagement with individuals who are considered at risk for developing substance use disorders, specifically those using opioids and using opioids intravenously.
